Dear Mr. Slager, Instructors, Parents and Students:

At this time in the development and promotion of the Global Taekwon-Do Federation in Canada, it is essential that all Instructors work together to maintain the high technical standards, integrity and work ethics that are representative of the late Grand Master Park Jung Tae, Founder of the GTF.

After Grand Master Park's death April 11, 2002, many rumours circulated about the stability of the Global Taekwon-Do Federation. There definitely has been a transition period but the GTF has never been divided nor has it wavered in its efforts to promote, develop and expand this Art of Taekwon-Do throughout the world. In fact, there has been a renewed commitment amongst the loyal and dedicated Grand Masters, Masters and Instructors to support and continue with the legacy left behind by Grand Master Park.

In GTF-Canada, Mr. Vito Palella is the President. He oversees all the GTF activities that take place in Canada and reports directly to the GTF President and GTF Executive Committee. Within Canada, there is Sask-GTF which is the only authorized body in Saskatchewan approved by the Global Taekwon-Do Federation. Mr. Washington Celis is the Chief Instructor and the official representative in that province. Instructors from other provinces cannot undermine Mr. Celis's position. All degree certification for members living in Saskatchewan will only be accepted through Sask-GTF which will then be approved by GTF-Canada and then forwarded to the GTF Headquarters for processing.

It has been brought to our attention that the above-noted Instructors have violated Sask GTF by-laws as stated in Clause 8.2 and the following will be effective immediately:

1. Termination of membership as members of Sask-GTF, GTF-Canada and Global Taekwon-Do Federation worldwide.


2. No further GTF Black Belt Certificates shall be issued to Instructors or students unless endorsed by Mr. Celis, Chief Instructor of Sask-GTF.
3. No invitations shall be extended to attend any events hosted by Sask-GTF, GTF-Canada and Global Taekwon-Do Federation worldwide. That includes the upcoming European Championships in Spain in June 2003.
4. All privileges lost to further practice/teach under the GTF umbrella organizations. As a result, Instructors and students must remove all GTF crests, logos and GTF materials from their uniforms and premises.
5. Infringement of the GTF rights in Saskatchewan warrants that these Instructors and students must abstain from representing the GTF in any manner. Legal action can be taken to protect Sask-GTF rights.

Since the Instructors have continuously ignored proper protocol and are not abiding by the approved Sask-GTF by-laws, we have no choice but to advise you of the consequences of their actions. Should any students feel compelled to continue his/her training in GTF, he/she can pursue this by contacting Mr. Washington Celis, Chief Instructor in Sask-GTF.
